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* * SUMMARY PARAGRAPHS EXPLAINING JUVENILE'S ATTAINED SCALE SCORES * *

TRUTHFULNESS SCALE: MEDIUM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE: 64
There is a tendency for this juvenile to be defensive and/or guarded which contributes to minimizing problems and concerns. Yet, this is an accurate JDE profile and other scale scores are accurate. Cautiousness and defensiveness may be situation specific. Truth-Corrected scale scores are accurate. This is a medium risk Truthfulness Scale score.

ALCOHOL SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE: 71 Alcohol abuse is indicated and may be a focal issue. An established pattern is likely or this juvenile is recovering (alcohol problem, but has stopped drinking). RECOMMENDATIONS: Substance abuse education and/or Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) might be helpful. With regard to alcohol, this is a problem risk (70 to 89th percentile) score.

DRUGS SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE

Drug (marijuana, cocaine, crack, heroin, etc.) use or abuse is likely.

Drug abuse is evident, or this juvenile is "recovering" (drug problem, but has stopped using). Relapse risk is high. RECOMMENDATIONS: Substance abuse counseling and/or Narcotics Anonymous or Cocaine Anonymous could be helpful. With regard to the Drug Scale, this is a problem risk (70 to 89th percentile) score.

VIOLENCE SCALE: MAXIMUM RISK RANGE

Violent tendencies are indicated and a pattern of violence appears to be well established. This juvenile could be dangerous to self or others. Ruthlessness, destructiveness, savageness and explosiveness are common. This is a violent person. This juvenile can be intimidating, threatening and potentially dangerous. Review records carefully for prior violent acts. Substance abuse could also exacerbate violence.

ANTI SOCI AL SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE: 89 An established pattern of antisocial behavior is evident. Problem risk scorers often have difficulty maintaining responsible relationships and loyalties. They are often callous, irresponsible and lack empathy. Many are boastful, deceitful, antisocial and given to tantrums. Poor work history is common. This is a problem risk score.
