CURRENT DUI

Driving Under the Influence (DUI): This is the Client's **second** DUI offense in the last 10 years. He could be subject to incarceration in the county jail (90 days or more), a fine (\$390 to \$1,000), suspended driver's license, possible Ignition Interlock Device (IID) installation and completion of a mandated state licensed DUI education/counseling program. In some cases, a restricted driver's license may be granted. **If probation is granted, incarceration time, fines and the duration of state licensed DUI education/counseling program involvement can vary.** And additional enhancements may increase the Client's DUI-related penalties.

Chemical (Breath, Blood, Urine) Tests. The Client's Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) level at the time of his arrest was 0.13%. BAC levels above the legal limit of 0.08% have serious consequences. And additional penalties can accrue when the driver's impairment status, driving records and applicable enhancements are taken into account.

Enhancements

Enhancements are serious aggravating circumstances that can influence DUI sentencing provisions and penalties. The client's DUI enhancement(s) are self reported.

- **Minor (Under 14) Passenger in DUI Vehicle:** A DUI or DUID client with a minor passenger could face up to 6 months in the county jail, a fine and may have to surrender their driver's license to the court.
- **On DUI Probation at Time of Present DUI:** Upon DUI conviction, the court can revoke or terminate the client's probation. Should this recur, the court can impose new levels of supervision and penalties.
- **Chemical (Breath, Blood or Urine) Test Refusal:** Failure to submit to a required chemical test may result in county jail or prison incarceration, a fine and an automatic one-year driver's license suspension.
- **Double-Fine Zone Enhancement:** The DUI or DUID client may be given increased fines and penalties for DUIs that occur in double fine (construction, maintenance or safety) zones.

Cannabis: This client's marijuana admissions place him in the problematic marijuana range. Marijuana use is problematic in terms of frequency, purpose and circumstances under which it is used. Maladaptive behaviors like impaired motor coordination and debilitated judgment often develop shortly after marijuana use. And when marijuana is used with alcohol or cocaine it is even more debilitating. Problem severity should match treatment intensity. Referral to a California licensed DUI education/counseling program with a marijuana treatment component might be considered. Marijuana use enhances this person's driver risk.

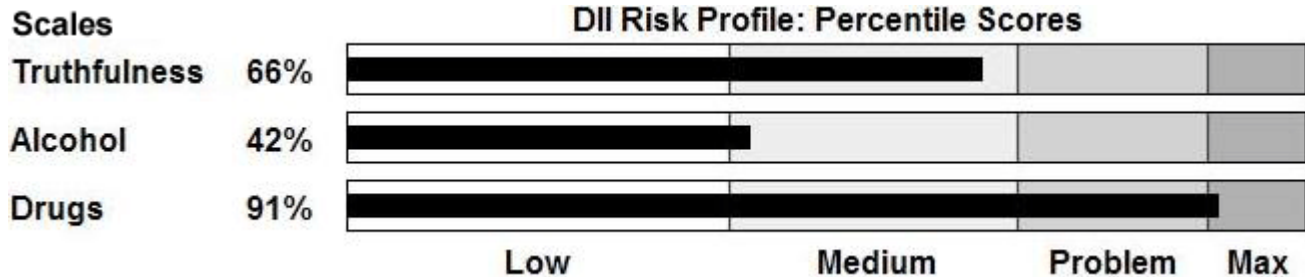
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Truthfulness Scale

Medium Risk Percentile: 66%

This individual's Truthfulness Scale score is in the problem range. This client is defensive and guarded regarding self-disclosure. However, truth-corrected scores are accurate. The DII truth-correction procedure is similar to the one used in the MMPI, which is the most widely used test in the U.S. The Alcohol and Drug Scales should be factual, correct and truthful



Alcohol Scale

Medium Risk Percentile: 42%

This client's Alcohol Scale score is in the Medium Risk (40 to 69th percentile) range. Alcohol use is likely, however, an established pattern of alcohol abuse is not indicated. Alcohol problems do not present as focal issues. Yet, to protect against wrongly classifying "recovering" alcoholics, precautions have been built into the DII. Alcohol admissions and the client's answer to the "recovering" alcoholic question (#61) are printed in the Significant Items section that follows. This client would benefit from a medium intensity DUI program or state licensed DUI education/treatment program involvement. Any applicable "enhancements" could raise the intensity of these recommended programs.

Drug Scale

Severe Risk Percentile: 91%

This individual's Drug Scale score is in the severe problem (90 to 100th percentile) range. An established drug abuse problem is indicated. Drug use and abuse may be extreme. Review the Significant Items section of this report. If recovery is alleged, how long? Relapse risk is also high. Drug problem severity is severe. Treatment effectiveness is enhanced when problem severity is matched with treatment intensity. Consider the Enhanced DUI Treatment Program or an intense state licensed DUI education/treatment program. This person's drug problem will benefit from an intensive treatment milieu, considerable time and an aftercare emphasis. This person needs help.
